What in the world is a bâton perce? Instructions for Teachers

Activity Overview

Ice Age people made mysterious objects called "perforated batons" (bâton percé is the French term). They are usually made from antler and have a large hole drilled near one end. Many are very decorative with carvings of animals on their sides. They are often found broken with a part of the drilled end missing. Some archaeologists think the hole on the end might be for straightening spears. Other think they might be a symbol to show the holder's importance in a group, like a monarch might hold a sceptre today. Others still think they might be equipment for holding ropes or making cord! What do your students think they were used for? We've created a blank baton so you can design your own.
