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PREHISTORIC MULTI-SITE ITINERARY

Why not extend your prehistoric experience by also visiting Arbor Low a well-known and impressive prehistoric monument? Sometimes referred to as 'the Stonehenge of the North' though it bears more of a passing resemblance to Avebury in Wiltshire owing to its henge bank and ditch, stone circle and cove.

Suggested itinerary

Start your day by visiting Creswell Crags, a place of life where our ancestors took shelter, hunted, socialised and created art. Then travel onward to Arbor Low and Gib Hill, to experience the atmosphere of this ancient burial site set amid the calm of the Derbyshire moorland.

Watch Out: Access passes through fields and woodland with gates, stiles and uneven surfaces, which can be challenging, particularly to wheel chair users and push chairs

Distance between the two sites: 37 miles



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
